This commitment to broader, better presence in the digital realm is not to the detriment of the physical publication of the journal on paper. We are aware of the value that this format holds for many readers. In a similar vein, we would also not like to think that the automation of certain processes would be construed as a hurdle to the maintaining of individual, direct contact with any individual who wishes to address us.

We know that this website will be the business card of our journal, the RTS image; however, beyond that, it is of particular importance for us that www.revistarts.com becomes an open gateway for receiving and sharing articles and reflections that will enable us to grow together. It should be the gateway to a welcoming forum that promotes networking in conjunction with all the stakeholders from the professional community. To achieve this, we need your help and, as a result, we would once again encourage you to submit research and experiences, to disseminate the RTS and the new website on social media and to send us your comments and proposals to allow us to improve on a continual basis.
